"I'm working on three projects in New York: a solo show at Carpenters Workshop Gallery, the Maison Kitsuné flagship, and a chandelier for a private client. I live in Paris and whenever I can, I try to leave the city. I usually do the same when I'm in New York. I always visit Dia: Beacon-to me it's the ideal museum and a dream setting for minimal art. And I try to go to Coney Island, birthplace of the age of fun, which has fallen into ruins. I never eat or play there. I only walk and observe. I'm currently looking for a vintage skyscraper pendant light, so I'll stop by the Demolition Depot to see what's new. For some mysterious reason, I'm always invited for dinner at Indochine, but when I can choose, I go to Miss Lily's by my friend Serge Becker. I also like going alone to Walter De Maria's Earth Room. It's a silent space, dense and powerful as a meditation. I love cabinets of curiosities and the biggest one in New York is The American Museum of Natural History. Even though it's always crowded, it's one of the few places where I am willing to wait. If I can find the time, I'll go see Maureen Gallace's exhibition at MoMA PS1. And finally, I usually walk around Isamu Noguchi's sculptures at The Noguchi Museum. His work was one of the inspirations for my solo show this September."
