Sotheby's wins right to sell \$600m Harry and Linda Macklowe art collection

Hockney garden pic hits the block; Art Basel creates 'solidarity fund' for dealers; Manhattan gallery marks 9/11

Most people enjoy hearing an artist talk about their work and now New York gallerist Sean Kelly and collector Dan Sallick have found a way to bottle the moment. They have devised what they are calling "The Artist Audio Experience", a way to access a unique, short audio recording through a smartphone as part of the purchase of a work. "Imagine if you could hear Van Gogh talking about his thoughts while painting 'The Starry Night' or 'Sunflowers' paintings," Kelly says. It launches with this week's exhibition of Chicagobased photographer Dawoud Bey at Kelly's New York gallery (September 10-October

23) while two of Bey's works will be offered with their complementary audio file at this week's Armory Show (September 9-12, \$35,000 each). The near-field communication technology, through an audio chip elegantly embedded within a glass cube, is the same as that used for Apple or Google Pay. Sallick finds that, for a collector, "it adds a new dimension to what you see and gives a reward for spending time with a work." I must confess, as I listened to Bey explain the "haunting feeling" behind his "Cabin and Benches" (2019) photograph from the gallery show, it worked a treat.
